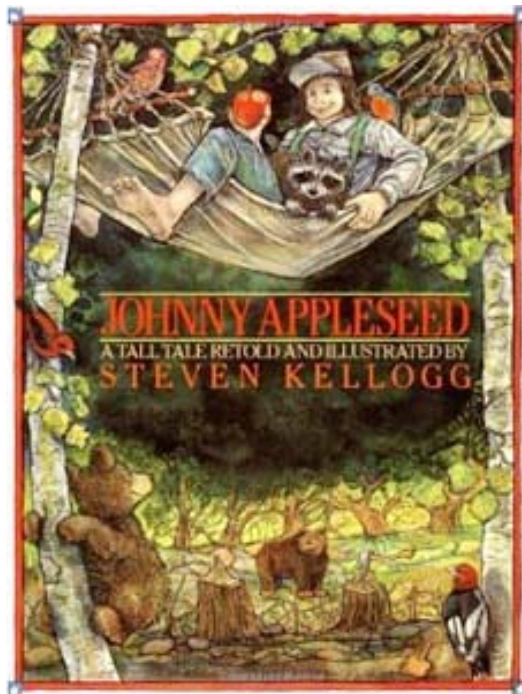


MORGAN SCHOOL'S BOOK OF THE MONTH 2011/12

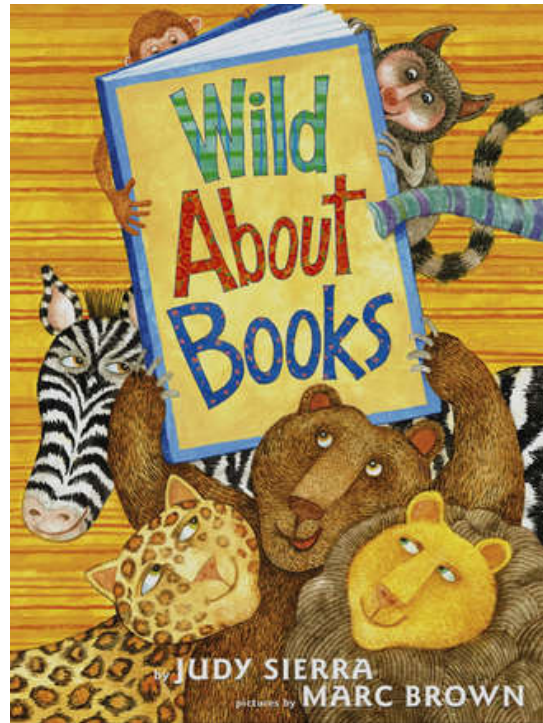
September – Johnny Appleseed, by Steven Kellogg

The story of Johnny Appleseed, just in time for the fall apple season.



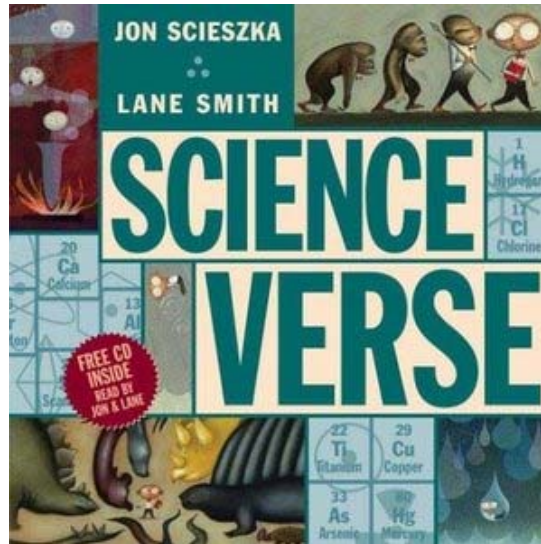
October – Wild About Books, by Judy Sierra and Marc Brown

A librarian mistakenly drives her bookmobile into the zoo and soon, the animals are gathering around to find out about “reading.”



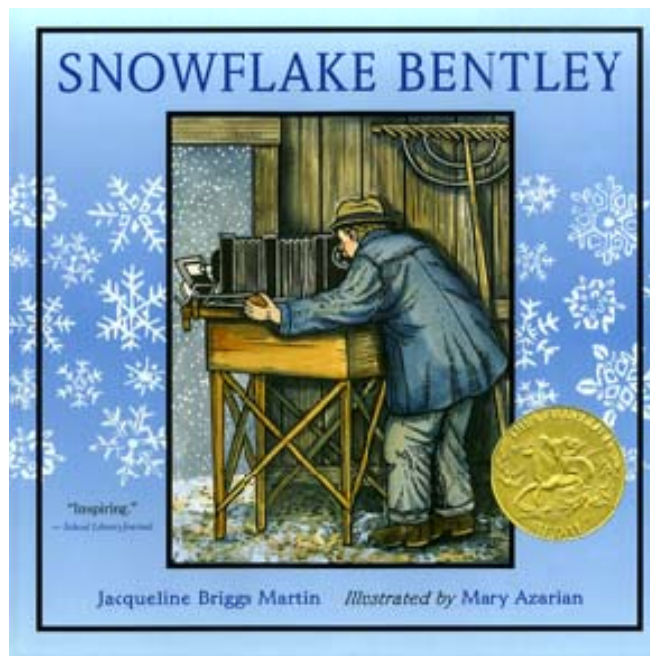
November – Science Verse, by Jon Scieszka and Lane Smith

A boy is listening to his science teacher talk about the “poetry of science” when suddenly all of his thoughts start to come to him in rhyme.



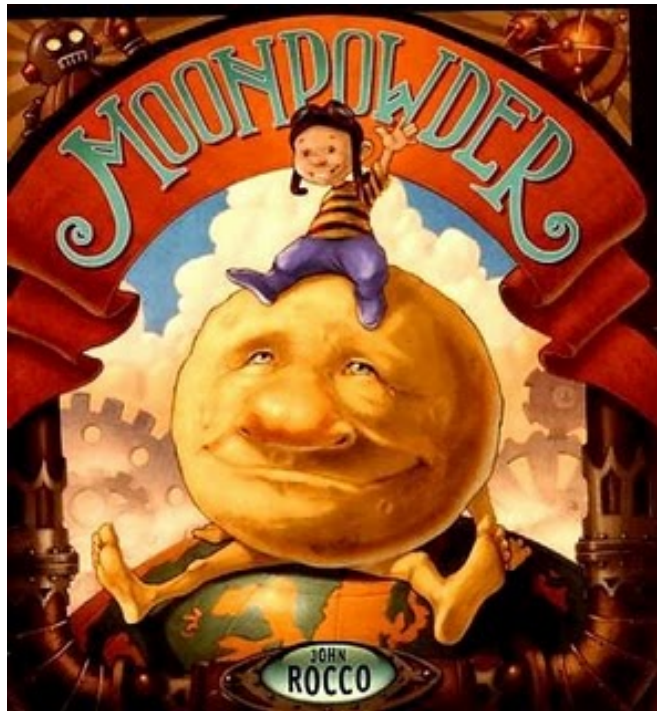
December – Snowflake Bentley, by Jacqueline Briggs Martin and Mary Azarian

This book tells the story of Wilson Bentley, who as a boy was captivated by snowflakes, and as an adult, spent his lifetime studying and photographing the crystals of ice.



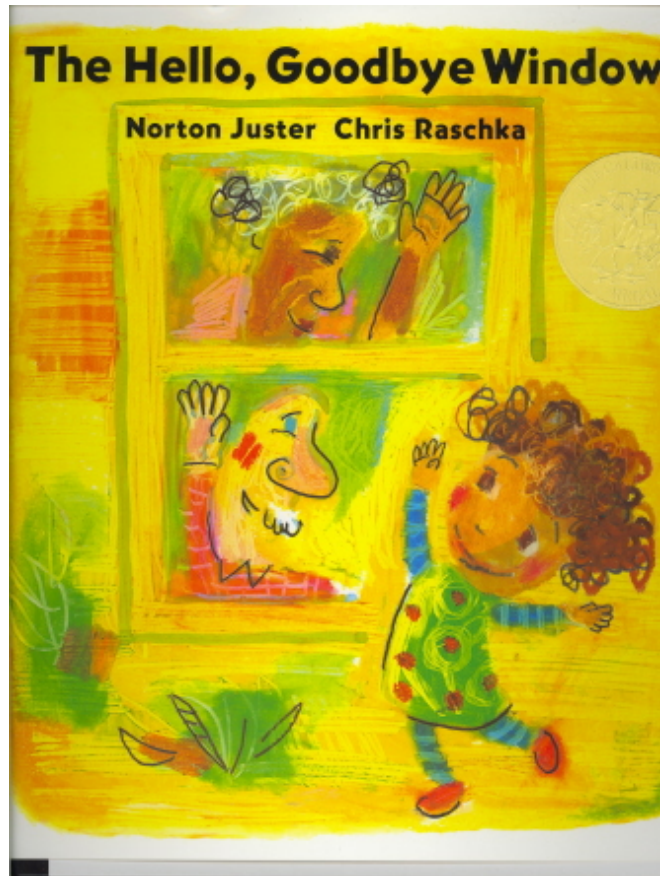
January – Moonpowder, by John Rocco

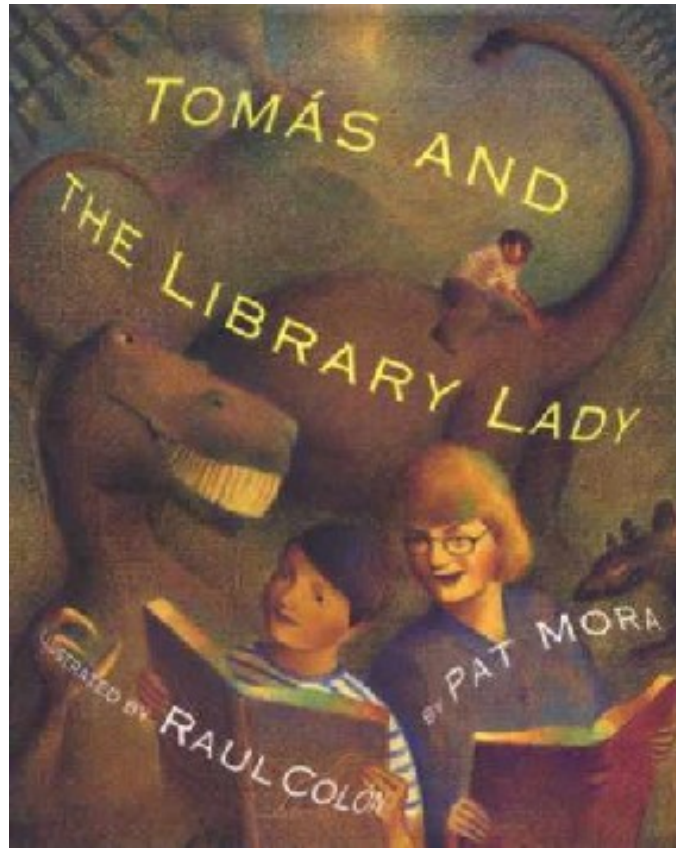
February – The Hello, Goodbye Window, by Norton Juster and Chris Raschka

A girl visits her grandparents and explores their large house, letting her imagination run wild.



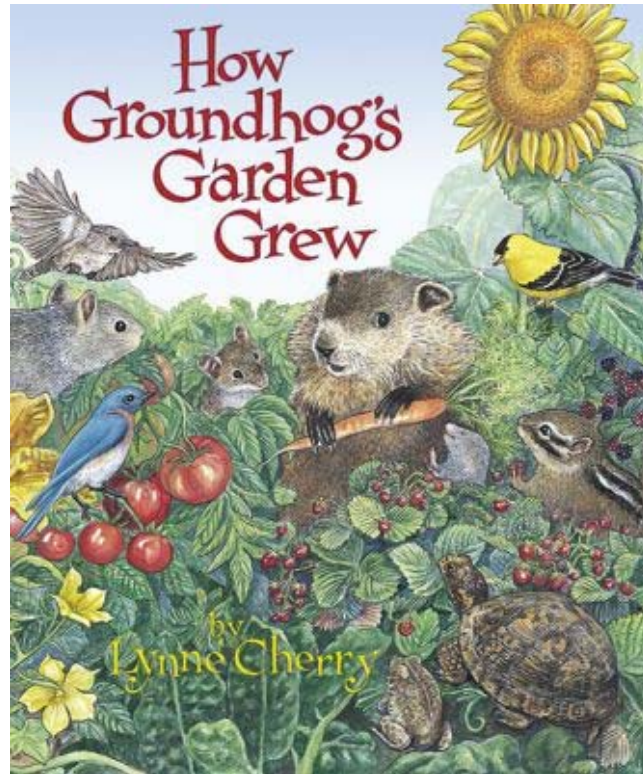
March – *Tomás and the Library Lady*, by Pat Mora and Raul Colon

The story of a child from a migrant family, whose local librarian nurtures in him a love of reading.



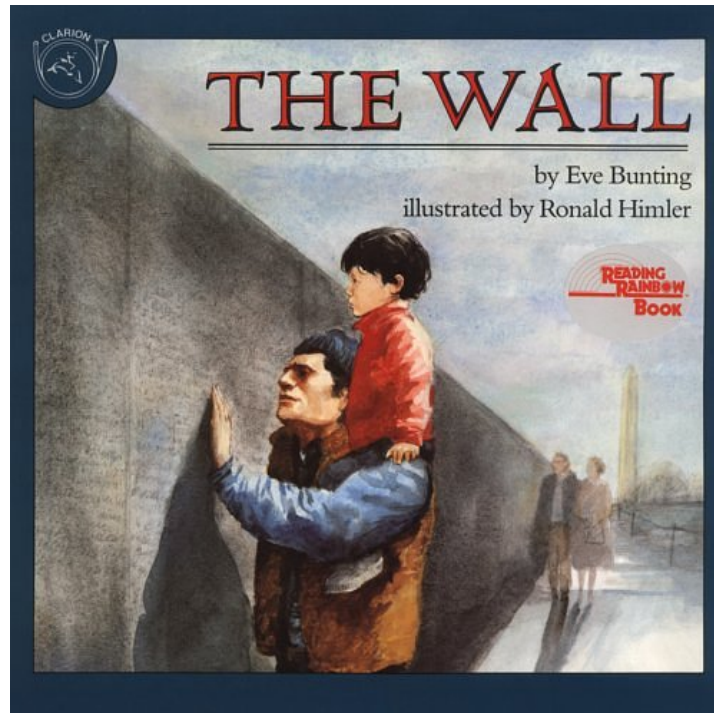
April – How Groundhog's Garden Grew, by Lynne Cherry
